This stunning Georgetown renovation combined two awkwardly joined homes that were built in significantly different historical and architectural periods. Glass Construction also built a colonnaded addition in back, shown here, for a state-of-the-art kitchen and great room. The great room boasts a "curtain wall" of windows and French doors, while the adjoining kitchen can be closed off for entertaining with folding doors.
